Animal Control

Dog tags for the 2014 year are obtainable starting January 1, 2014 and are considered late if not purchased by January 31, 2014. All dog owners are required to obtain a 2014 Annual Dog License per Ordinance #652. Licenses will be valid from January 1 through December 31, and are to be renewed each year thereafter. No license will be issued without rabies vaccines being current, if you are unsure if rabies vaccine is current please contact your veterinarian. If you currently have a certificate on file with City Hall and are in the system we can check the expiration dates on the certificates. If you do not have a certificate on file with City Hall you will need to provide one at time of licensing.

Any license purchased after January 31st will be charged a \$25.00 late charge for all dogs currently in the system. Any dog licensed with a Lifetime tag is still valid under that licensing. If you no longer own or have a dog that was registered with a lifetime tag please notify City Hall so that the dog can be removed from the list.

If you licensed a dog under the annual licensing and no longer have the dog, please notify City Hall so that we can remove the dog from the system.

Animal Control will be strictly enforcing Ordinance #652 and checking all licensed and unlicensed dogs within the City.

Business Licenses

The annual fee for a business license is \$30.00 and is renewable by January 1st. If you have not received your renewal application in the mail, it can be printed out online at www.cityoftieton.com.

All businesses in the City are required to have a current 2014 Business License.

Building Permits

If you are planning a project please contact City Hall to inquire about a permit and what will be required to obtain one, or if a permit needs to be obtained.

From the Public Works Director

Right of Way: It is very important that vehicles are removed from city right-of-way whenever there is a significant snow fall. This will help city crews do a more efficient job of clearing snow and ice.

Sidewalks: Please remember to keep the sidewalk clear for pedestrian safety. Snow should not be shoveled or blown into the street; this creates hazards for both the homeowner and for drivers.

Shoveling your Driveway: When shoveling your driveway apron or sidewalk, shovel from left to right (with your back to your house) this should help prevent snow plows from pushing excess snow back into your driveway.

Water Department:

Water conservation ensures that the city will have reliable safe drinking water for many years to come. Teach your kids about water conservation to ensure a future with clean water used wisely. Re-evaluate the way you use water. Do not leave the water running while you brush your teeth or do dishes. Use only what you need. Repair any type of leak as soon as possible; if your faucet drips 10 drops per minute you waste 0.8 gallons per day and 292 gallons per year. By taking these steps you not only save water but you save money as well.

Please help the Public Works Department in keeping our City the "TOP" of the Yakima Valley. We take pride in our City, and hope that everyone feels the same. Remember, if you have a water break and need your water shut off for repairs, you need to contact City Hall. During normal work hours or weekends, call City Hall and leave a detailed message, including phone number and address, on the emergency option. Someone will contact you as soon as possible. Keep safe and have a wonderful rest of the year!!
